## CITY OF TORRANCE ANTI-CAMPING ORDINANCE

The City of Torrance has an ordinance prohibiting camping in public places when shelter is available. Individuals who choose to continue camping in public rather than accept available shelter may be cited or arrested, and prosecuted for a misdemeanor.

### 45.6.6 CAMPING IN PUBLIC PLACES.

a) It shall be unlawful for any person to use any of the streets, highways, sidewalks, parks or public places, including, but not limited to, parkways, beaches, bus stop sites, the Transit Center, the civic center, and the Madrona Marsh Preserve and Nature Center as a camping place at any time; provided, that this Section shall not prohibit sidewalk vending operations pursuant to a permit issued by the Finance Director under Chapter 14, Sidewalk Vendors, of Division 4, Public Health and Welfare.

The City has partnered with Harbor Interfaith Services to provide navigation to reach permanent housing along with outreach services. The City supports efforts to end homelessness and is providing resources to individuals in need.
